Jay Pruett, Director of Conservation for The Nature Conservancy's Oklahoma Chapter, will present **Conservation for Birds – Life at the Tallgrass Prairie Preserve**. Jay is responsible for development and implementation of conservation initiatives for the state and oversees the management of TNC preserves. He acts as TNC's representative to federal, state and local conservation agencies and organizations, and is also involved with wind energy and electric transmission siting issues with regard to wildlife and its habitats at state, national and international levels.

He graduated from Rice University in Houston, Texas, with a major in Biology, retiring in 2003 from a long career as head of environmental affairs for an electric utility company.

Jay will discuss current bird conservation strategies in the Tallgrass Prairie Preserve at this month's meeting.
